



1. HSIA-FEI CHANG

LES JEUX SONT FAITS. RIEN NE VA PLUS.

22.07.2023 - 15.10.2023

Since the late 1990s, Hsia-Fei Chang (1973, Taipei) a Taiwanese artist, has developed a protean œuvre whose content is situated in a tragi-playful and popular register. Her artistic practice is located between performance, in-situ installations, video, photography, sculpture and writing. Chang belongs to the generation whose training was inspired by several cultures. She draws her references from her own past and her everyday life, deriving a narrative between reality and fiction in which she uses her body as a statement.

In the exhibition entitled Les jeux sont faits. Rien ne va plus., Chang plunges visitors into the world of gambling in a famous Parisian casino where she worked for two consecutive years as a croupier, alternately managing Blackjack, Punto Banco and Ultimate Poker tables. Here the floor of the space is completely covered with the carpet of the gambling club. Chang documented this immersion in a series of photographs entitled New Life of a Woman (2022): selfies and other images taken with her telephone in the club cloakroom and rest area and published on Instagram. Time takes shape in this work, the artist's boredom and exhaustion being palpable. The capture of these «instants of existence» testifies to the monotony and disillusion specific to this nightlife and its environment. Just as in her film New Life of a Woman (2021), which is made up of images and short filmed instants of her professional life, private life and life as a mother. Here the title takes on a sarcastic twist and ends up sounding like a 1950s advertising slogan. Life goes by, roles increase in number. Into this parade of images, the phrase «Les jeux sont faits. Rien ne va plus.» is interspersed on a wall in neon with the colours of the rainbow. Chang uses the phrase every day at the tables and ends up seeing it as a metaphor for social and/or gender determinism.

Through herself, Hsia-Fei Chang casts a cold and unaffected eye on the world of work, fatality and human relations. Chang had already explored cultural stereotypes with Place du Tertre – Montmartre (2006). Based on this closed but globalized world of gambling, the artist makes her longest performance by appropriating the profile of a beautiful young woman dedicated to entertaining others, and in this way, she again directly interrogates the role of women in our western society.

Josée Hansen and Wolfgang Ullrich discuss Hsia-Fei Chang's photographic project «New Life of a Woman», which is not only conceived for the exhibition space, but was originally created in social media. To what extent is it indebted to practices common there, but also makes it its own subject? Indeed, Chang uses image types such as the selfie, practices various forms of photographic self-staging, questions what it means to accept a role or be charged with one. His images deserve close examination, as they can teach us a great deal about current image practices, between fake and fiction.


